## Access UOW 2010

### Route 55 **gong shuttle** Free

**Route 55c (clockwise) and 55a (anti-clockwise)**  
The Gong Shuttle connects Wollongong City to the University. Buses travel in both directions around the following route: Wollongong Campus, TAFE, Weerona College, Wollongong Hospital, Wollongong Station, Crown Central, North Wollongong Beach, the Innovation Campus, Campus East, Fairy Meadow, and back to Wollongong Campus. It runs 7am to 10pm weekdays and 8am to 6pm on weekends. Weekday services leave UOW every ten minutes in the morning 7-9am and afternoon 3-6pm, and every 20 minutes at other times. Weekend services operate every 20 minutes. See [www.uow.edu.au/about/transport](http://www.uow.edu.au/about/transport) for more detail.

### Route 9 **UOW North Gong Shuttle** Free

**UOW - North Gong Shuttle (anti-clockwise)**  
This service connects train travellers and residents of International House, The Manor and North Wollongong directly with the ring road around the University. It operates weekdays from 7:30am to 10:30 pm all through session and exam periods\*. Buses run on average every 7 minutes through peak periods (8-10am and 5-6pm), and between 10 and 20 minutes apart at other times. They are timetabled to match with trains wherever possible. \*A reduced timetable operates at other times of the year, and a special Saturday service runs during exam periods. ### New Trial **UOW Northfield Shuttle** Free

**Gwynneville-Keiraville Shuttle (anti-clockwise)**  
This service connects UOW to Keiraville, northern West Wollongong, Gwynneville and Smiths Hill areas. It's a trial service running every 15 minutes from 8:00am to 10:00am and from 4:30pm to 7:30pm and every 30 minutes thereafter with the last bus leaving the Uni just after 10:00pm. The route takes buses anti-clockwise around the University Ring Road, Robsons Rd, Reserve St, Greenacre Rd, Weerona College, Throsby Dr, circles Keiraville, back along Throsby Dr and comes back to the Uni via Foleys Rd, Gipps Road and Eastern St. This is a trial service and may change depending on utilisation. Note that this Shuttle visits the UOW Ring Road stops, but **does not go past or stop at the bus terminus on Northfields Ave**. ### Using Bus services

**Hailing the Bus**  
To ensure that drivers see you, (especially in areas where visibility is poor), always hail the driver by raising your arm. The driver will know that you want that particular bus to stop.

**Getting off the Bus**  
To let the driver know that you want to alight at the next stop, you should either, press the red button located on the pole attached to the seat, or press the touch pad strip located along the luggage racks.

This will activate the stopping sign located at the front of the bus (where fitted) and will also notify the driver by way of an audible sound.

**Paying your Fare for regular bus services**  
Tickets can be purchased from drivers upon boarding the bus. It is appreciated if you could have the correct fare for the driver. The 3 shuttles to the uni are free of charge.

**Concession Cards and Free Travel Passes**  
For Concession Card and Free Travel Pass recipients, please have your pass ready to show the driver when boarding a bus.

Student concession icons are automatically added to your student id card if you are a domestic student. This covers your first year of travel. Contact Student Central to update your concession icon each year. Unfortunately the NSW Government does not provide travel concessions to international students.

**A pleasant environment for all**  
In the interests of all our passengers please refrain from smoking, eating, drinking or playing loud music on buses.



### Cycling & Walking

If you live close to the University why not consider it? Walking & cycling offer not only health benefits but also economic, environmental and social benefits.

Best of all walking & cycling do not attract any fee for parking on campus. You must however, park your bike within the designated bike racks located on campus, which are close to most buildings. They are not to be chained to light posts, trees or building structures.

All paths in the University are shared walking and cycling paths. Cyclists are also welcome to use the roads, but must be very careful when moving between paths and roads. Courteous cycling is as important as safe cycling. Give way to pedestrians and use your bell to alert those who can't see you.

If walking or cycling at night it is preferable not to do so alone. Organise to walk or cycle with a friend. Contact University Security if you have any safety concerns: 4221 4900 for emergencies or 4221 4555 for general enquiries.

### Car pooling at UOW - Free Parking

To encourage fewer cars, less greenhouse emissions and additional savings to those who carpool, the University offers free parking for cars bringing 3 or more people to the Wollongong Campus. Arrive at the Western Carpark (P4) between 8.00am and 3pm, Monday to Friday with 3 or more occupants to get free parking. Note that cars need to have transported all occupants to the University. It is not acceptable to pick up additional passengers from in or around the Campus.

### Train services

North Wollongong station services the University of Wollongong and it is on the South Coast Line. From Sydney (Central), the journey takes approximately 100 minutes.

A free shuttle bus runs between North Wollongong Station and the main campus, see details above for the North Gong Shuttle.

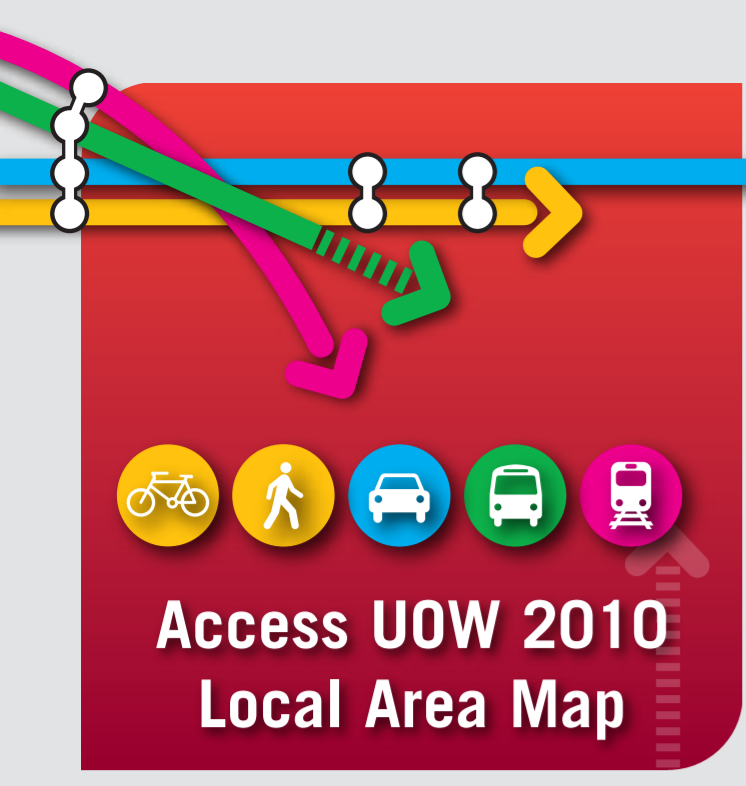
### Trip Planner

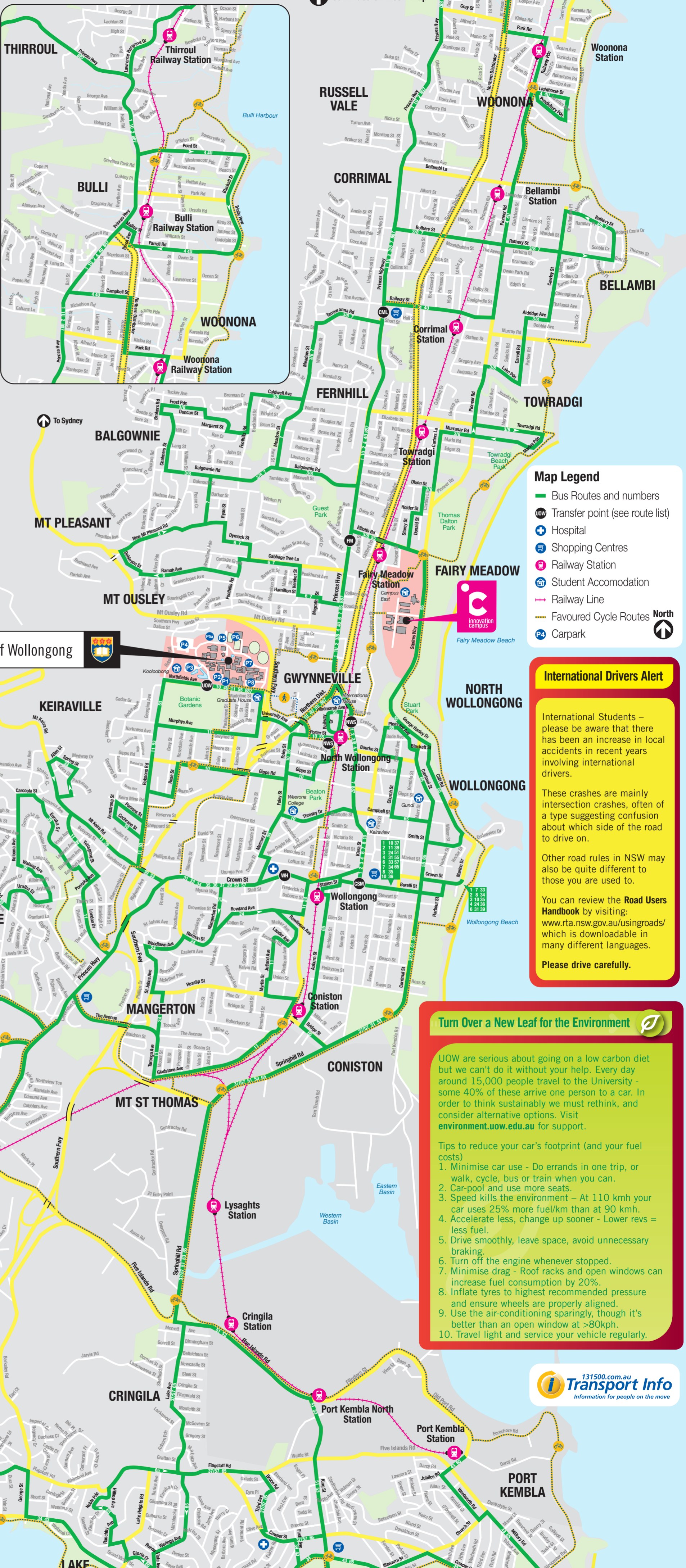

### Turn Over a New Leaf for the Environment

UOW are serious about going on a low carbon diet but we can't do it without your help. Every day around 15,000 people travel to the University - some 40% of these arrive one person to a car. In order to think sustainably we must rethink, and consider alternative options. Visit [environment.uow.edu.au](http://environment.uow.edu.au) for support.

Tips to reduce your car's footprint (and your fuel costs)

1. Minimise car use - Do errands in one trip, or walk, cycle, bus or train when you can.
2. Car-pool and use more seats.
3. Speed kills the environment - At 110 kmh your car uses 25% more fuel/km than at 90 kmh.
4. Accelerate less, change up sooner - Lower revs = less fuel.
5. Drive smoothly, leave space, avoid unnecessary braking.
6. Turn off the engine whenever stopped.
7. Minimise drag - Roof racks and open windows can increase fuel consumption by 20%.
8. Inflate tyres to highest recommended pressure and ensure wheels are properly aligned.
9. Use the air-conditioning sparingly, though it's better than an open window at >80kph.
10. Travel light and service your vehicle regularly.
